Improperly set pressure reducing valves allowed excess pressures to reach the hoselines; some of them burst handlines, while others were difficult to control. Firefighters could not use elevators because fire department policy prohibited their use. All equip-ment (including over 300 air cylinders) had to be carried up stairs to fight the fire. The buildings electrical system and internal communications systems also failed, primarily due to water damage. Several occupants were rescued from the roof by helicopter. A crew of firefighters was flown to the roof to access the stairwells and rescue other trapped occupants. These efforts were unsuccessful because the stair shafts had become virtual chimneys. The electrical failure shut down stairwell pressurization fans. Stairwell doors, kept ajar by handlines, allowed...
